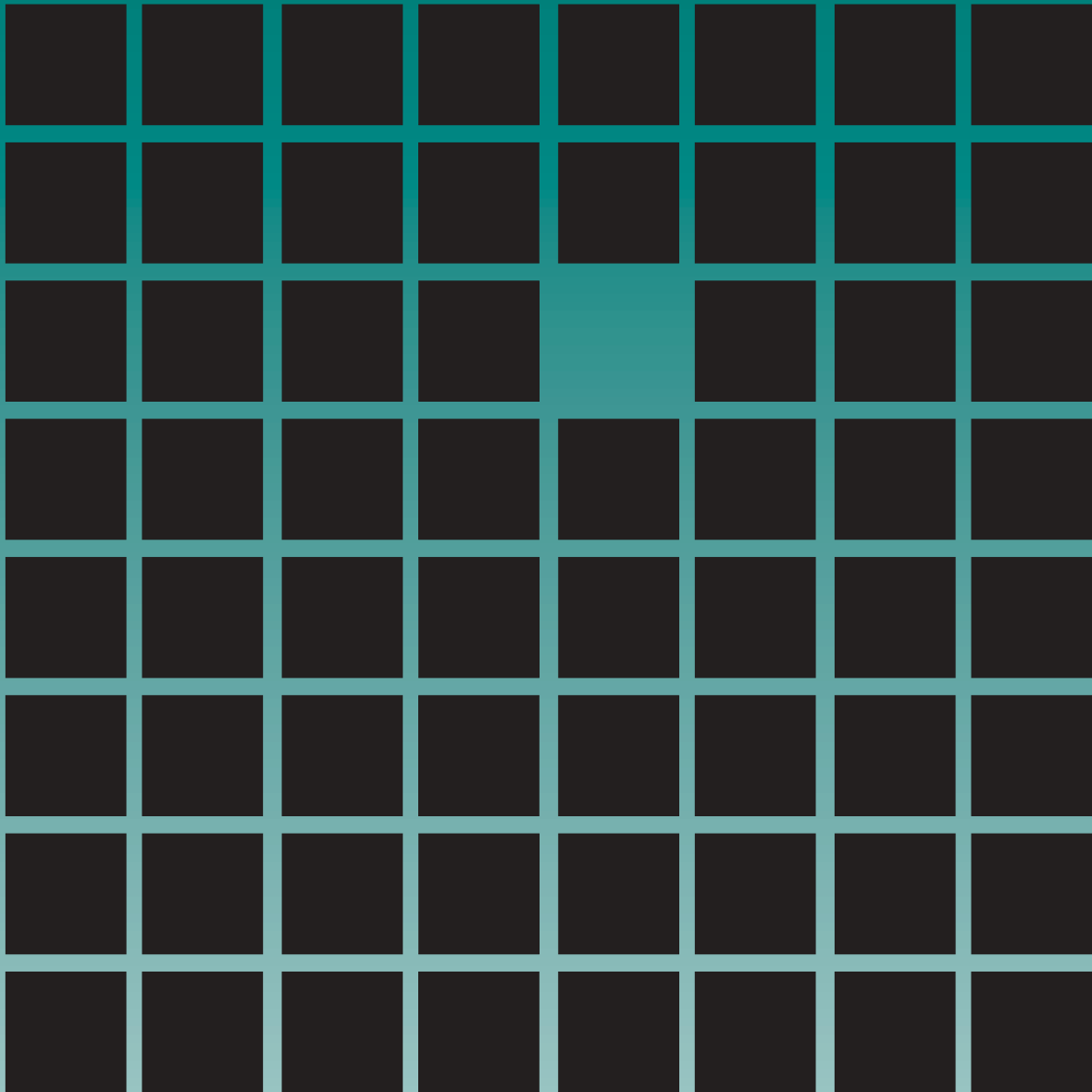

## GENERAL INFORMATION

The New Jersey Chapter of the American College of Emergency Physicians is proud to present this year's exciting program. The annual NJ-ACEP Scientific Assembly has been designed and coordinated by Dr. Victor Almeida, NJ-ACEP Education Committee Chairman. The Scientific Assembly offers current information on timely issues and current techniques to help emergency physicians, residents and emergency health care providers enhance their practice. The courses will be presented by faculty selected for outstanding teaching ability and expertise in their specified field within emergency medicine.

## LEARNING OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of the program participants should be able to :

- Understand the Concert Recertification process developed by ABEM
- Know which articles will be used by FY 2004
- Know how to prepare for the yearly online examination and the main recert exam
- Recognize the characteristic patterns of puzzling dermatologic conditions
- Understand the basic pathophysiology of dermatologic conditions
- Understand current treatment recommendations for dermatologic conditions
- Review the basic sequence of steps involved in rapid sequence intubation
- Review the indications/contraindications, pitfalls, and advances of rapid sequence intubation
- Review clinical cases where rapid sequence intubation was used to reinforce the above goals
- Present a practical four-step approach to emergency airway management focused on the route of intubation and RSI decision making
- Present a pre-planned laryngoscopy strategy focused on and epiglottis first approach, recognition of posterior laryngeal structures, external laryngeal manipulation (bimanual laryngoscopy), and head elevated positioning
- Explain why straight-to-cuff stylet shaping is essential for target visualization during intubation and avoidance of esophageal intubation
- Review the roles of introducers, lighted stylets and optical stylets in epiglottic only situations
- Describe paraglossal straight blade laryngoscopy and its role in emergency airway management
- Describe and review alternative intubation devices and approaches that are potentially applicable for emergency situations
- Understand the formulary for ED Sedation Medications
- Develop an understanding of situational use of ED Sedation Medications
- Develop an approach to complications for ED Sedation
- Become familiar with recent changing trends and current general principles for ED management of oncologic emergencies
- Become familiar with the clinical symptoms and signs for early recognition of the emergency complications of cancer
- Learn the emergency management of neurologic, cardiopulmonary, metabolic, infectious, and treatment complications of oncologic disease
- Discuss and appraise the most recent pharmacologic agents affecting clinical practice of emergency medicine
- Heighten physician's awareness of emerging infectious airborne threats
- Recognize the signs and symptoms of several mosquito-borne illnesses
- Summarize the criteria for SARS and distinguish it from other entities

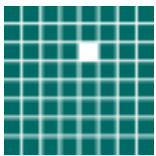
